OF MRS. BERRY OPENED

The inquiry into the death of Mrs.

Minnie Berry, wife of Ezekiel Berry of

Forest Hill, Albert county, was com-
menced yesterday afternoon before

Magistrate John W. Gaskin, when

Ezekiel Berry was charged with the

murder of his wife, Minnie Berry, George

Prosser, complainant, told of the morn-
ing in question, when the accused came

to him and said his wife had drowned

herself in a pool near the house. The

witness said he examined the body, but

found no trace of a pool. The witness

told of seeing tracks around the pool,

but saw no evidence of snow being

crushed near the water. There were

two tracks made by moccasins leading

to and from the culvert at the northern

end of the pool.
