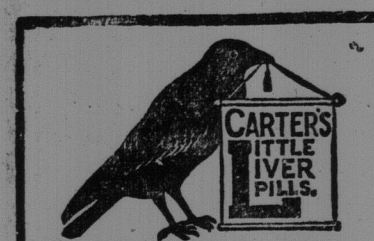

BRITAIN'S BIGGER POPULATION

(United Empire, London.)

The general assumption is that the ranks of Great Britain's workers have been seriously depleted through losses in the war. But Great Britain will actually have a bigger population, both working and actual, than it had there had been no war. If Britain has lost 500,000, or even as much as a million men, the losses have been more than made good, because against these losses are set the following:

- Five hundred thousand persons (estimated as official returns are no longer published) "saved" to this country at the expense of the dominions, by checks on imperial immigration since August, 1914, compared with the same period previous thereto.
- Three hundred and eighty thousand Belgians settled in England. Some will go back; some will stay.
- Twenty thousand additional Chinese, Japanese, West Indians, Americans, and

2.—From a labor standpoint we must also add:—

Three hundred thousand fewer persons in receipt of "poor law" relief here.

Five thousand less prison population, now effective fighters or workers.

One million additional female workers, now mostly in munition factories and other former masculine occupations.

3.—The British home increase in population before the war was one million net every three years, even after allowing for the net migration outwards of 250,000 per annum. The boom marriages, infant-life saving crusades, and improved standards of living for the workers have kept up our survival rates even after allowing for reduced births.
