C. P. R. ADOPTS A **NEW SYSTEM HERE**

Safeguarding Against Accidents on Section Where Traffic is Very Heavy

Another improvement which will help to make the C. P. R. terminal facilities at St. John among the best in the country is the adoption of the electric staff despatching system. The apparatus has been installed and the new system will be used in future, commencing on Sunday, Septem-

The purpose is to simplify and safe-guard despatching on sections where there are a great many trains handled and it will be given a splendid opportunity to show its usefulness on the sections be-tween St. John and Fairville. Instead of a train conductor receiving a written order he will be given a short staff which is taken from the electrically connected apparatus which works on the connected apparatus which works on the block system. Dr. Paul Pfeifer of Vienna, in a discussion on the subject of homes for theological students, reported the scarcity of candidates for the priesthood in Austria and Germany, and the inadequate provisions for training candidates as compared with the excellent provisions made for the students in the colleges of the United States. He declared that the unsatisfactory facilities for boarding students in Vienna was largely responsible for their small number and urged the erection of students homes on the lines already contemplated by the University of Vienna.
