

St. John to Halifax Express Seven Hours Late — Snow Blow-in at Nappan.

Amherst, N. S., Feb. 6.—Owing to a snow blow-in at Nappan, five miles east of Amherst, main line traffic on the C. N. R. suffered another tie-up this morning. Number 10, St. John to Halifax express, due to leave Amherst at 3.55 a.m., did not get away until 10.40. The local train from Springhill Jct. to Moncton was held at Springhill for three hours. A freight caught in the snow at Nappan Bridge and unable to push its way through was brought to Nappan in seven sections, two locomotives from the Amherst yards being used.
