## SENDS OUT GIFTS TO SOLDIER SETTLERS

Red Cross Forwards Christmas Cheer to 12 New Brunswick Families

Christmas boxes for 12 soldier settler families scattered throughout New Brunswick were packed yesterday at the Red Cross depot in Prince William street by a corps of members of the local branch of the society. There were 55 children to be thought of and every gift was carefully chosen. The Junior Red Cross of the province contributed scarves, sweaters, caps and picture books which they had made. From the provincial Red Cross funds supplemented by gifts there were provided the other presents of warm clothing, a cup and saucer for the mother, cigarettes for the father, nuts, candy, figs, tea, books, dolls and a few other toys.

The committee assisting with the packing yesterday consisted of Mrs. L. P. Longley, president of the Saint John branch, Mrs. Heber Vroom, Mrs. Margaret Lawrence, Mrs. W. R. Pearce, Mrs. J. H. Doody and Mrs. Fred Girvan. The Red Cross has sent these Christmas boxes each year to soldier settler families in remote districts, many of whom would otherwise have no Christmas cheer.

## 12 Words of Burns Bring \$40 at Sale

LONDON, Dec. 18.—Twelve words of Burns' manuscript fetched \$40, at Sotheby's recently. The fragment was written in praise of Colia, in Ayshire, of which the poet said:

Farewell, old Colia's hills and dales, Her healthy moors and winding vales.

An autograph poem "to the Unco Guid" in eight stanzas, sold for \$1,775 and another poem to Miss Jane Frier, afterwards Mrs. General Graham, realized \$1,375.

The sale was of rare books and manuscripts, and a total of over \$62,000 was realized, about \$10,000 being paid for various Burns' items.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 18.—With a splintered bullet hole through the windshield, the automobile used by the three bandits in their getaway following the spectacular robbery of the Manitoba Liquor Commission cashier of \$15,000 yesterday morning, has been found by the police.
