U. S. TOURISTS CUT CANADIAN VACATION BILL

Spent 23 Per Cent., or \$43,000,000 Less in 1932 Than Year Previous

By Central Press Canadian Washington, April. - Estimated expenditures in Canada by United States tourists during 1932 were approximately \$140,000,000, as compared with estimated outlays of \$120,000,000 in 1931 and \$115,000,000 in the peak year, 1929.

Offsetting this total of United States funds made available in 1932 to Canadian tourists was about \$77,000,000 in the United States and rail on during the past calendar year.
