LOCAL

Penian Veterans. In connection with the bonus to be paid to the Penian Veterans the Governor-in-council may at any time before December 31, 1913, grant the bonus to any volunteer called out for active service in 1866.

British Visitors. Sixty of the leading business men of Great Britain will visit Canada during the summer, and will be in St. John about June 15th.

Disabled Horse. In the police court yesterday morning James McKenna, who was charged by the S. P. C. A. with having a horse unfit to live, was ordered by the Magistrate to have it destroyed. Two drunks were also before the court and were given the usual punishment.

Logs Running Freely. Fredericton, May 14.—Reports from up river state that the logs are running freely, the recent rains in the water level being a great benefit to the drives, which have not yet come into the corporation drive.

GENERAL

Cyclone in Hungary. Budapest, Hungary, May 14.—A number of villages near here were destroyed by a cyclone on the 14th inst. A large number of lives were also lost.

Another Comet.

London, May 14.—Dr. Hanson, a Danish astronomer, has discovered an immense comet in the constellation of Cygnus. This comet has since been seen from the Greenwich observatory.

Not Much Hope. Boston, May 14.—Governor Ross will not commute the death sentence of Clarence T. V. Richeson. It is still the death chair or the insane asylum. Life imprisonment will not be considered.

London, May 14.—King George has expressed great indignation at a picture postcard which represents him to be in favor of the Ulsterites.

New Haven, May 14.—Great anxiety is being felt for Harry Whitney, sportsman and explorer, who was due to reach civilization from a hunting trip to the far north three weeks ago.

Expensive Ride.

Truro, May 14.—Stipendiary Magistrate Grove fined the drivers of the automobiles which showed the mayor and aldermen of Moncton the town, five dollars each for exceeding the speed limit.

JASPER PARK.

Mr. Geo. Brewster of Banff, a member of the firm Brewster and Moore, in speaking of Jasper Park that is being opened up by the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific, stated that it will excel any of the Canadian parks as a pleasure enjoyment.

Mr. Brewster has been through the district and says it is exceptionally well stocked with wild game of all kinds; also that it is a splendid country for mountain sheep, as well as moose, deer, bear and mountain goats.

The mountains in Jasper Park are higher than in any other Canadian territory, and as soon as the Grand Trunk erects the hotels that they propose and the government gets the per trails throughout the territory, it will become more popular than the rest of the mountain resorts on the continent.

THE GRAND TRUNK EXTENSION IN THE COMMITTEE STAGE

Boston, Mass., May 14.—A sub-committee of the legislative committee on railroads reported to the full committee today on a bill permitting the Southern New England Railroad, a subsidiary of the Grand Trunk system, to extend its lines to Boston.

The extension proposed by the Grand Trunk officials is to come in three directions—from the authorized line from Palmer to Providence; from Bellows Falls, Vt., and also from Blackstone, Mass.

BOOM BREAKS, MANY LOGS LIKELY LOST

Quebec, May 14.—As a result of the violent south wind blowing today, the boom of the late St. Paul Lumber Company broke at about noon today, carrying about 100,000 logs. The loss will be heavy as it is quite probable that scarcely half of the logs will be saved.

Detroit, May 14.—Pres. Navin of the Detroit American League Baseball Club announced today the purchase of pitcher Bill Bailey from the St. Louis American. Bailey, a southpaw, was long considered one of Detroit's greatest "hoodoos."

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. Any person who is the sole head of a family and who has been 13 years old, must have possessed a quarter section of available Dominion land in the Northwest Territory or Alberta. The applicant must make an application to the Dominion Lands Agency, at St. John, for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister or intending homesteadeer.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteadee may live within the limits of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteadee in good standing may reserve a quarter section standing as a homestead. Price \$1.00 per acre.

Due to land made upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each year, including the time required to earn (homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

A homesteadee who has exhausted his pre-emption right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$10.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, and erect a house worth \$200.00.
