

## MY SHOPS AND FACTORIES ARE OPENING AGAIN

Most of Them Operating Under a Cut in Wages of Employees.

Albany, N. Y., Jan. 3.—Nine hundred car workers, employed at the West Albany shops of the New York Central Railroad who were laid off on December 23, when the shops were closed for an indefinite period, returned to work there today.

Williamsport, Pa., Jan. 3.—The New York Central shops at Aris re-opened this morning with one-half the regular force, after being entirely closed for two weeks.

Ten Per Cent. Cut.

Lowell, Mass., Jan. 3.—The Union Cotton Mills here, one of the plants of the American Textile Corporation, announced today that full time operation would be resumed at once, but that a reduction of ten per cent. in wages would be made effective.

Lawrence, Mass., Jan. 3.—A. J. Morris, general secretary of the American Textile Corporation, announced today that representatives of fifteen New England locals would meet in Boston soon to discuss the general situation in the textile industry and to determine what attitude should be taken in case the American Woolen Company should announce a wage reduction.

## BRITAIN HAS NEW CREDIT BOND PLAN

Early That Scheme Will Be Before Cabinet at an Early Date Now.

London, Jan. 3.—A comprehensive scheme for the establishment of credit bonds and other proposals having their object the rectification of foreign exchange rates is understood to have been submitted by Sir Robert S. Squire, president of the Board of Trade, at a conference today with leading financiers of the country.

Sir Robert invited criticism as a result of which, it is anticipated, an important plan will shortly be placed before the cabinet and if adopted, will have the backing of British financiers and insurance magnates. It is hoped the scheme also will assist materially in solving the unemployment problem.

## PRISONERS LOYAL TO THEIR BAND

Jackson, Mich., Jan. 3.—Loyalty to the prison brass band, which is to play at a public gathering at Lansing on New Year's day, has prompted a man, recently paroled, to return to his former position as leader and the other, who paroled in effective tomorrow, to remain at the prison until after the programme. The men are "Tommy" Robinson, who was paroled December 20, the leader of the band, and Charles Harrington, a player. Both men were sentenced in 1910 to serve life sentences for murder.

## CHINAMAN WHIPPED TWO ARMED THUGS WHO TRIED ROBBERY

Knocked First Gunman Down, Took His Gun and Chased the Other up Street.

Montreal, Jan. 3.—Two highwaymen, who attempted to rob a Chinaman at the corner of Laguardie street and St. Lawrence Blvd., early Sunday, and with a display of revolvers demanded the money and valuables of their intended victim, had their illusions as to the Chinese docility, rudely dispelled when the Chinaman, in spite of the odds against him, promptly showed fight, taking the offensive with such energy and spirit that the bandits were routed.

The encounter took place about 2.30 o'clock in the morning, when Charles Gee, a worker in a north end laundry, was on his way home. Gee grasped with the first bandit and threw him heavily, possessing himself of his gun, which he had dropped in the struggle. He then grappled with the second, but the first had started to run away and the second tore himself away and ran too.

The Chinaman had about \$50 in his pocket and was wearing an expensive gold watch and chain.
