LEGISLATURE OF NEW BRUNSWICK

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY. FREDERICION, March 9—Afternoon.

After dinner the discussion of the Fredericton assessment bill was continued. The clause providing that all incomes of residents be taxed in Fredericton caused some discussion, Mr. Ryan moving that the salaries of members of the executive who are non-residents be exempted.

Hon. Mr. Fraser moved further to amend the bill so as to exempt Provincial and County officers obliged to perform office duty in Fredericton. He said those receiving salaries from the Province, should not be taxed in Fredericton, though performing office duty there.

Hon. Mr. Tibbets asked if the clause was to be construed to also oblige a man resident in Fredericton to pay taxes in that city, on all property owned by him, wherever situated in the Province.

Hon. Mr. Fraser said it might be so construed, and as a parallel section, was in the general act, both the bill and the FREDERICTON, March 9-Afternoon. are now taxed twice on the same proper-ty in the Province, which seems unfair. The section of the bill might now be passed over and it could be properly am-ended after the other sections had been passed. Fredericton, he thought, had no right to tax a man on personal property owned by him in Victoria or any other county where it was also taxed.
