Recommended, that any expense incurred by Mrs. Bascom for mailing Reports, and not met by the Unions receiving them, be assumed by the Provincial Union, the Reports also to be sent prepaid to the Depository.

The Superintendent of Soldiers' Work, Mrs. Acheson, brought word that a contingent from South Africa would, in all probability, pass through the town during convention. A committee was appointed consisting of Mrs. Acheson, Miss Wiley, and Mesdames Gordon and Fisher, who were empowered to notice the coming of the soldiers in any way they deemed wise and helpful.

The following committees were then appointed:—

Plan of Work—Mrs. Acheson, Convenor; Miss Wiggins, Mesdames Stevens, Cavers, Irwin, Livingstone and Britton.

Resolutions—Mrs. McKee, Convenor; Mesdames Gordon, Bigelow, Wrigley, Fisher, Munroe, Reede.

Courtesy—Mesdames Clark and Frost.

Local Finance—Mesdames Waters and Baird.

Crédentials—The Corresponding Secretary, the Treasurer and Miss Wiggins.

Banner Committee—Mesdames Britton and Waters.

Appropriations—Mesdames Waters, Darch, Bryan, Bascom.

Recommended, that Mrs. Baird, who will be in charge of the Registration book, receive the 50c. fee for the billeting fund.

Recommended, in view of the increasing size of the Annual Report, and consequent added expense of its publication—while the price remains the same—the Unions this year be asked to pay their own expressage and postage, thereby helping to decrease the annual deficit.

Further Recommended, that the change be noted in the circular letter sent out from the Provincial Union, also a letter be sent the Journal, notifying the local Unions of this change.

Consideration of Convention programme followed. The programme was accepted as printed.

A motion to adjourn was carried, Mrs. Gordon dismissing the meeting with prayer. The committee rose.
