

An Act to amend the Acts relative to Land Surveyors, who have studied and practised in any of Her Majesty's dominions other than this Province.

(Corrected Copy.)

**I**N amendment of the Acts relative to Land Surveyors; Her Majesty, Preamble.  
&c., enacts as follows:

I. Any Land Surveyor or Civil Engineer, being a subject of Her Majesty by birth or naturalization, who has served a regular apprenticeship of not less than three years to a Land Surveyor or Civil Engineer in any of Her Majesty's dominions, and who has been employed by any Provincial Land Surveyor in Upper Canada, as an assistant Land Surveyor, either under an agreement in writing or otherwise, for a period of six months, and who shall have had during that term at least three months actual field practice, shall be eligible to receive a certificate to practise Land Surveying in Upper Canada; Provided always, that such Land Surveyor or Civil Engineer shall pass an examination in the Science of practical Land Surveying as provided for by the fourth section of the Act passed in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and chaptered thirty-five, but no preliminary examination shall be requisite before he can enter into such agreement for service with a Provincial Land Surveyor, nor shall he be liable to examination in Geology or Mineralogy under any Act amending the Act aforesaid: And it shall be lawful for any practising Provincial Land Surveyor in and for Upper Canada, with whom such Land Surveyor or Civil Engineer shall claim to have practised previously to, or may practise after the passing of this Act, to furnish such Land Surveyor or Civil Engineer with a certificate, wherein shall be set forth the date of commencement and full particulars of such practice, and a copy of such certificate shall be transmitted by such Provincial Land Surveyor to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners of Provincial Land Surveyors for Upper Canada, and shall be filed in the office of such Secretary for future reference; And it shall be lawful for the Board of Examiners of Provincial Land Surveyors for Upper Canada to examine and admit such Land Surveyor or Civil Engineer, on proof of his having complied with the provisions or requirements of this Act, to practise Land Surveying in Upper Canada, as if he had complied with the conditions or requirements of the several Acts now in force: Provided further, that nothing herein contained shall exempt such Land Surveyor or Civil Engineer from paying into the fee fund such sum as may be required by the said Acts for his admission as a Provincial Land Surveyor.

Land Surveyors and Engineers admitted elsewhere, may be admitted in Upper Canada.
