The following Petitions were severally brought up, and laid on the Table:—

By Sir James A. Grant,—The Petition of George Earl Church, Civil Engineer and Contractor, and others, of the City of London, England, and others of the City of Ottawa; the Petition of Loop Sewell Odell, of the City of Quebec, in the District of Quebec, and Province of Quebec, Merchant; and the Petition of the Great North-west Central Railway Company.

By Mr. Lachapelle,—The Petition of the Montreal Island Belt Line Railway Company.

1. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Eleven thousand and twelve dollars and fifty cents be granted to Her Majesty, for the Governor General's Secretary's office, for the year ending 30th June, 1896.

2. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Thirty-three thousand eight hundred and fifty-five dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for the Office of the Queen's Privy Council for Canada, for the year ending 30th June, 1896.

3. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twenty-three thousand five hundred and eighty-five dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Department of Justice, including \$200 additional to the salary of G. L. B. Frazer, \$600 for the Private Secretary of the Solicitor General, and a salary of \$300 to Thomas Pickens, messenger, (notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Civil Service Act), for the year ending 30th June, 1896.

4. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Five thousand six hundred and seventy-five dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Department of Justice, (Penitentiaries Branch), for the year ending 30th June, 1896.

5. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Forty-four thousand eight hundred and seventy-five dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Department of Militia and Defence including \$100 to provide for the promotion of J. A. McCann, (notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Civil Service Act), for the year ending 30th June, 1896.

6. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twenty-eight thousand one hundred and sixty-two dollars and fifty cents be granted to Her Majesty, for Department of Printing and Stationery, for the year ending 30th June, 1896.
