## 1990 Student Activity Awards Point Schedule

All students who are in their final year at the Frederictor campus of UNB are eligible to apply. Students who have previously received a Student Activity Award will only be considered for a higher level of award, and in any event, only if their activity in the interim warrants such

Merit Awards are intended to recognize any student who has made a contribution to student life which is worthy of recognition. Silver Awards are intended to recognize: those students who make a particularly meritorious contribution to student life in a variety of areas, during their time at UNB; those students who make an outstanding contribution in a limited area during their years at UNB; and those students who make an outstanding contribution in a variety of areas during a limited part of their time at UNB. Gold Awards are intended to recognize those students who have demonstrated an outstanding commitment to student activity and campus life in a variety of ways during their years at UNB.

Important Note: These points are intended as guidelines only. While the Committee will take notice of the point totals, in any case where it feels that a student has been unfairly prejudiced or advantaged by the point system, the Committee reserves the right to recommend any award at the level it feels is justified. Where point ranges are given for a particular activity, points will be awarded according to the degree of responsibility, time commitment; and breadth of the contribution.
