Open parking plentiful at \$2 a day

While inflation has hit just about everything from golf clubs to tees, it has not touched the price of visitor parking at the Canadian Open in Oakville.

Again this year, the Oakville Lions Club is providing \$2 per day parking in huge fields adjacent to the lush Glen Abbey Golf Course, just north of the Queen Elizabeth Way.

The fields, located at the corner of Upper Middle Road and the Fourth Line, are expected to accommodate more than 15,000 cars.

The Fourth Line entrance (see map) at the corner of Upper Middle Road will accommodate most visitors. Holders of executive package permits will enter through the maintenance entrance at the Fourth Line, just south of Upper Middle Road.

There will be a separate entrance on the North Service Road for golfers, golf association officials, press and volunteers.

Spectators from the Toronto area should travel west on the QEW and exit at the Dorval Drive interchange and follow the signs to the course along the North Service Road to the Fourth Line and north to the parking areas.

Those travelling west on Highway 401 should exit at Trafalgar Road, go west on Dundas Street (Highway 5), south on the Third Line and east on Upper Middle Road to reach the parking areas.


Visitors from Hamilton and other points east can get off the QEW at Bronte Road and drive north to Upper Middle Road and then east on Upper Middle Road to the parking spots.

The same route should be followed by those taking 401 to Bronte Road and travelling south on Bronte Road.

Signs will mark the routes.

This year street-side parking will be strictly curtailed in the areas around the golf course, including the Fourth Line, Upper Middle Road and the North Service

Motorists' co-operation is politely requested.



Special bus runs begin June 21

Oakville Transit will operate special buses to and from Glen Abbey Golf Club during the Canadian Open

Buses will leave from the corner of Church Street and Dunn Street hourly from 9:20a.m. to 3:20 p.m. and at 4:25 p.m. and 5:25 p.m. June

Buses will also leave the GO station on the half hour from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Departures from both points arrive at the

golf course hourly from 9:50 a.m. to 5:50 p.m. Buses return from Glen Abbey starting at 9:55 a.m. and running hourly until 4:55 p.m. The last two buses of the day leave at 5:50 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.

Buses arrive at Church and Dunn streets at 10:20 a.m. and every hour thereafter until 3:20 p.m. The last two arrive at 4:25 p.m. and 5:25

Buses arrive at the GO station at 1:10 p.m.,

2:10 p.m., 3:10 p.m., 4:15 p.m., 5:15 p.m., 6:10 p.m. and 6:50 p.m.

The service has been reduced from last year when it was found that running buses every half hour was unnecessary, said transit manager Bob Evans.

Peak hours, however, will be serviced by more than one bus this year
