Canada, very properly dissatisfied with a list of key commodities from which the master key was absent, proposed that petrol and coal should be added, provided that the non-league States were willing to co-operate.

An official communique said a Canadian proposal adopted by the sub-committee provided that the list of "Key-Products" barred to Italy should be extended by various articles "as soon as conditions necessary to render this extension effective have been realized."
