FREE FRENCH OCCUPATION OF ST. PIERRE

The following reply to the sequiry of the United States Government as to the steps which the Canadian Government was prepared to take to restore the status quo of the islands was made to the United States Minister in Ottawa yesterday evening:

"Canada is in no way responsible for the
Free French occupation of St. Pierre. We
have kept in close touch with both the
United Kingdom and the United States on this
question and have always been ready to cooperate in carrying out an agreed policy.
We declined to commit ourselves to any
action or to take any action pending such
agreement. In the circumstances, and
until we have had an opportunity of considering action with the President and Mr.
Churchill, the Canadian Government cannot
take the steps requested to expel the Free
French and restore the status quo in the
islands."
