On motion, *Relolved*, That this Houfe do unanimoufly agree in the opinion fo generally expressed by former Houfes of Assembly, that the jurisdiction exercised by the Instance-Court of Vice-Admiralty in this Province, is grievous and oppressive; and do therefore request Mr. Speaker to continue his correspondence with the Agent of the Province, and to state, that from the manner in which all the official situations in that Court are held, it is more particularly objectionable than at any former period, and most earnessly to folicit His Majesty's Government to abolish that Court.

Resolved, That the above named Committee do join Mr. Speaker upon the subject above mentioned.

A Meilige from the Council, by Mr. George :

Mr. Speaker,

The Council have agreed to a Bill, entitled, An Act to revive, continue and amend, an Act to provide for the fupport of a Light-Houfe at the South end of Coffin's Island, on the Eastern fide of the entrance of Liverpool Harbour, with an amendment, to which amendment they defire the concurrence of this House.

The Council have paffed a Bill, entitled, An Act in further addition to, and amendment of an Act, paffed in the third and fourth years of his prefent Majefty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the relief of Infolvent Debtors, to which Bill they defire the concurrence of this Houfe.

The Council have appointed the Honorable the Treasurer, the Attorney-General, and James Fraser, a Committee for the porpose of uniting with a Committee to be appointed by the House of Assembly, to take such measures as may be necessary to carry into effect the objects expressed by the joint Address of both Houses to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, relative to the late Convention with the United States of America, and the other objects reported on by the joint Committee of both Houses in the prefent Session.

And then the Messen withdrew,

The faid Bill was read a first time.

Resolved, That the Bill be read a fecond time.

On motion, resolved, That a conference be defired with the Council, on the fubject matter of the faid Bill, and that the Clerk do request the fame.

The Clerk reported that the Council had agreed to the Conference as defired by the House.

Ordered, That Mr. Haliburton, Mr. Cogswell, and Mr. Prescott, do manage the faid Conference.

And they went to the Conference,

And being returned,

Mr. Haliburton reported that the Managers had been at the conference, and stated the fubstance of the conference to the House.

On motion, the engrossed Bill from the Council, in further addition to, and amendment of, an Act, passed in the third and fourth years of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the relief of Infolvent Debtors; was read a second time.

On motion, resolved, That the Bill be now committed to a Committee of the whole House; and thereupon,

The House refolved itself into a committee of the whole House, on the confideration of the faid Bill accordingly.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. James took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee, that they had gone through the Bill
