All the Plaintiffs Won

At the County Court before Judge Greig here last week all plaintiffs in the three actions won. The first victor, Orin Hogland, was awarded \$700 damages against his father-in-law, John Beater of town. The next successful suitor was Mr. John Kyle of Chesley, who in a suit for \$150 balance on a year's rent of a farm leased to John White, got judgment against White for \$110 and costs. The tenant, it seems, did certain fixing and repairing about the place, and put this as an offset against the rent. It transpired that much of this work hadn't been ordered by the landlord, with the result that the Judge only allowed deft. \$40 for this, and ordered him to pay the balance of \$110, together with the costs of the action. The last case on the list was a suit brought by Seaman Bros. Ltd., of Warton against George Voght, formerly of the 160th Brass Band, to replevin a quantity of lumber and to recover an amount of about \$600. The court held that plaintiffs were entitled to the lumber and also gave judgment in their favor for \$580.50. The defendant's counterclaim against the plaintiffs was dismissed.

A report is current among the boys of the 160th Battalion at Bramshott, which tickles their fancy, and yet seems almost too good to be true. "We are living in hopes of going to France as a unit. In fact it is almost certain," is the news that a member of the battalion who is usually pretty well informed, writes home. If the Bruce Battalion is permitted to go to France as a body, it will be the first Battalion that has been so favored since the early part of the war. Members of the 160th had long since given up hope, if they ever seriously had any, of retaining their identity as a regiment and they will certainly be a tickled bunch if they get to France together.

It is reported that the Battalion will move back to Witley C-up shortly to form part of the 8th Can. Division. The move will not take place for a little while though as nearly the whole battalion is still quarantined for mumps.



A Costly Chase

The inmate who skipped last Fall from the Bruce House of Refuge and was recaptured recently at Tobermory, and brought back to the grating grubbery, stuck the county for \$20.00 for his escapade. When High Constable Ward's bill for the capture of the fugitive came before the County Council at Walkerton last week it incited a spirited discussion, one legislator going so far as to suggest that he ought to have been pushed off at the Tub. As there mightn't be a handy whale around when this Jonah fell in, there was a horrible chance that he might, like a glass of beer before prohibition, "cross the bar." The silver lining to the dark cloud is that the county hadn't to supply the oats during his absence, but as it had to provide a new suit on his return, there is still occasion to fall on his neck and weep.

Seed Oats Supply

The past unfavorable season has caused a great shortage in the supply of good seed oats in Ontario and Western Quebec. Even the best samples we have seen should be graded about 30 per cent. to make them suitable for seed. Rather than sow light grain from a stunted crop, farmers are well advised to purchase their seed.

The special grade for seed oats established at the Government interior terminal elevators last year, will serve as a much needed source of supply. This No. 1 Canada Western seed oats must be 95 per cent. white oats, sound, clean, free from other grain and from noxious weed seeds within the meaning of the Seed Control Act, and shall not weigh less than 34 lbs. to the bushel. It is available through the usual channels of commerce for grain.—Seed Branch, Ottawa.
