READJUSTMENT OF TARIFF.

As the Government press have endeavored so assiduously to make a case out of Sir John's recent declaration that he advocated a readjustment and not a general increase in the tariff, and have accused him of being insincere in all his former statements on the matter, we take the liberty of reproducing a short extract from Sir John's address in the House upon moving the amendment which freshened the national policy of the future.

"If we had a protective system in this country, if we had a developed capital, we could, by giving our manufactures a reasonable hold on our home trade, attain a higher position among the nations. If our factories were fenced round to a certain extent with protection, it does not mean that we should adopt a tariff like that of the United States, which I believe to be in many respects an unjust tariff, and which is imposed upon the necessities of Canada which demand, our national prosperity would be enhanced."
