On the 2nd day of January, 1917, at the said Council Chamber, in the City Hall at the hour of 10 o'clock in the forenoon is hereby appointed for the summing up of the number of votes given in the affirmative and in the negative respectively.

BY-LAW NO. 1393

Of the Corporation of the city of Brantford.

The municipal council of the corporation of the city of Brantford enacts as follows:

1. That the following question be submitted to the ratepayers of the City of Brantford entitled to vote on money by-laws:

Are you in favor of having the municipality construct and maintain a municipal gas plant?

2. That the votes of the ratepayers shall be taken on this question at the same deputy returning officers and the same poll clerks as are named for the taking of the votes of the electors at the ensuing municipal elections.

3. A true copy of this by-law shall be published in the following newspapers on the days hereinafter mentioned, that is to say: The Courier and Expositor newspapers, and a true copy of this by-law shall be posted at the City Hall, at the Post Office, at the Court House and at the Fire Hall in the said City of Brantford.

On the 27th day of December at 10 o'clock in the forenoon the mayor will in writing signed by him appoint two persons to attend at the point two persons to attend at the clerk of the corporation, and one person to attend each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of the answering of the affirmative and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of the answering of the said question in the negative respectively.

On the 2nd day of January 1917, at the said Council Chamber in the City Hall at the hour of 10 o'clock in the forenoon, is hereby appointed for the summing up by the Clerk

of this corporation of the number of votes given in the affirmative and in the negative respectively.

STRENGTH OF CANADIAN FORCE

Free \$40 per acre.
