The New York Homestcad, in ar interesting review of the barley trade, Canada in 1891 was 28,000,000 bushels, almost all being six rowed. The total exports were 9,975,508 bushels, of which all but some 40,000 came to more attention to the production of our own barley, brewers are using a sub-titute for malt, and because of our increased duty on the Canadian product.
