FLOODS IN COLORADO.

The Pueblo River Overflows and Does Great Damage.

Three Large Steel Railroad Bridges Carried Away.

Many Narrow Escapes from Death by Drowning.

PUEBLO, Colo., May 27.—The high water in the Fountain river reached a great height last night, tearing the Colorado and Southern Railroad tracks, flooding the cellar of the Pueblo hospital and doing other damage. At Butte Station on the Rio Grande Road, the section house and other property was destroyed. A number of tent dwellers had a narrow escape, two women being compelled to cling to a tree for several hours. A small house and tent was carried off. The three large steel railroad bridges of the Santa Fe, Missouri, Pacific and Colorado Southern roads, all within a quarter of a mile above the Fountain river were swept away. The approach to two city bridges and those of the county bridge north of the city were undermined and then destroyed.

DROUGHT IN AUSTRALIA.

Returns From Last Harvest Fall Away Below Estimate.

Hardly Enough Wheat for Their Own Needs.

Great Advance in Prices—A Good Chance for Canada.

OTTAWA, May 26.—J. S. Larke, commercial agent in Australia, writes under date of April 21 to the Department of Trade and Commerce:

The drought conditions of Australia have become more serious since my last report. Rains have mitigated the evil in portions of South Australia, Victoria and the southern part of New South Wales, but unless more rain falls the benefit will prove transitory. In the larger portion of New South Wales and in Queensland there has been no rain, and the crops of wheat, wheat, butter and cheese have gone up rapidly. Misled by the estimate of grain crop, exportations of grain and flour were made to London, but when the harvest was reaped it was found the estimates were about ten million bushels too high, and practically all the surplus has been shipped. Vessels which had been chartered had their charters cancelled and in one or two cases vessels already loaded with wheat and flour were recalled to port and unloaded. Should the drought continue there will be a serious diminution of acreage sown and next year Australia will not grow enough for her own needs. Prices have risen enormously in the last six months. The prices, Mr. Larke says, indicate the possibility of considerable trade for Canada.

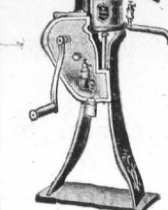
