Result of Delaying The Embargo

To the Editor:
The current issue of the Paper Trade Journal New York contains the following announcement:
"The St. Regis Paper Company has decided not to carry out its plans for the erection of a paper mill in Canada for the present. The Company recently acquired a site near Quebec and has extensive timber limits in its pulpwood out of Canada instead of manufacturing it into pulp

paper within the province."
Plans for the erection of a new mill above referred to were announced by the St. Regis Company several months ago about the time that Parliament passed a bill empowering the government to stop the exportation of raw pulpwood but which has never been implemented. The mill was to have been capable of producing 200 tons and later on between 200 and 300 men and the support to probably 1000 to 1500 persons.
The reason why the company prefers not to build the mill at

present and to continue to ship its Canadian pulpwood to the United States to be manufactured are not far to seek.
This is not the only development held up by the delay in applying the pulpwood embargo authorized by parliament.

One night through the vast audience rooms of Windsor Castle went the solemn words.
