**HALF MEASURES UNACCEPTABLE**

PARIS, Sept. 30.  
Germany's recall of General Von  
Der Goltz from the Baltic Region will  
not satisfy the Supreme Council, it is  
asserted, the Council being determined  
to place economic pressure on Ger-  
many until all the German soldiers  
are withdrawn from the Baltic. The  
German soldiers at present in this  
region are variously estimated at  
from 50,000 to 100,000. They appar-  
ently are determined to restore the  
old Russian regime there.

**TOWN WIPED OUT.**

ST. JOHN, N.B., Sept. 30.  
Oromocto, the picturesque and  
thriving shire town of Sudbury Coun-  
ty, was almost totally destroyed by  
fire to-day with a property loss of at  
least \$500,000. The fire started in the  
River Valley Lumber Company's Saw  
Mill, and the Mill offices and yard with  
about 4,000,000 feet of lumber were  
destroyed, together with five stores  
and several dwelling houses. The  
Lumber Company's loss alone is  
\$200,000.

**AGAINST A STRIKE.**

LONDON, Sept. 30.  
The Executive of the Amalgamated  
Society of Engineers has decided  
against a strike. Mechanics, however,  
must refuse to accept work done pre-  
viously by members of the National  
Union of Railwaymen.

**ANOTHER FALLEN IDOL.**

BERLIN, Sept. 30.  
The great wooden Von Hindenburg  
Monument, which, during the war,  
was studied by the populace with  
nails representing so much money,  
will be demolished this week, accord-  
ing to the Vossische Zeitung.

**INTENDS TO STICK IT.**

Fiume, Sept. 28.  
Gabriele D'Annunzio, the poet leader  
of the Italian forces in Fiume, this  
afternoon gave out a statement, ex-  
pressing his unalterable determination  
to hold Fiume until it is annexed to  
Italy. "We are here to stay until we  
are through with our task of having  
Fiume annexed to Italy. We will not  
leave under any consideration, until  
our object is accomplished."

**OBJECTING TO SOLDIERS.**

LONDON, Sept. 30.  
The district underground railway  
started an eight minute service to-day  
between Hammersmith and Mansion  
House Station. Troops were on duty  
in all the main London depots to-day.  
The waiting rooms have been trans-  
formed into temporary quarters for  
soldiers. The men of the Severn tun-  
nel branch of the National Union of  
railwaymen have given the Govern-  
ment forty eight hours notice to with-  
draw the military guard guarding the  
tunnel. Unless the troops are with-  
drawn the pump men are to be called  
out.

**BRITISH OCCUPY ODESSA.**

VIENNA, Sept. 30.  
Troops from the British fleet in the  
Black Sea have been landed in Odessa,  
and have occupied the city, according  
to advices received in Budapest.

**NO COMPENSATION ALLOWED.**

LONDON, Sept. 30.  
It was announced by the Govern-  
ment to-night, that no employment al-  
lowance would be paid to workers  
thrown out of employment through  
the railway strike.

**COLD STORAGE LEGISLATION.**

WASHINGTON, D.C., Sept. 30.  
Additional Legislation, recommend-  
ed by President Wilson, as a means of  
reducing living costs was passed to-  
day by the House and sent to the  
Senate. It would limit the time of hold-  
ing food in cold storage to twelve  
months, and requires that, when re-  
leased, such food be marked plainly  
with the date it was placed in storage.

LEITH, Sept. 30.  
The Caledonian railway has posted  
notices, offering men returning to  
work twenty five per cent. above the  
present rate and also precedence for

future promotion. Protection is as-  
sured all those accepting.
