

Laboratorium May be Arranged for Germany.

Financiers of That Country in England-Irish Negotiations at Breaking Point--Ulster Premier Defines Position of That Province.

IRISH GOVERNMENT CONSIDERS MORATORIUM FOR GERMANY.
LONDON, Nov. 30. The British Government was considering the proposed moratorium for Germany were considered in official circles today. The moratorium was discussed in what was made known this afternoon that the interview which Dr. Baumbach, former German Minister of Reconstruction, had with Robert Horns, Chancellor of the Exchequer, yesterday, was for discussing other things of the Moratorium question.

REPARATIONS AND REPARATION PAYMENTS.
LONDON, Nov. 30. The visit to London of Dr. Baumbach, former German Minister of Reconstruction, and his Secretary, Dr. Horns, well known as an economic expert, following closely on last week's presence here of Hugo Stinnes, German financier, is accepted in official banking circles as heralding a new discussion and possibly a new arrangement for Germany's reparations payment. The arrival of the German agents yesterday has to supreme anxiety in financial circles—quarters where Germany's ability to meet her obligations has been the foremost concern during recent weeks. What is believed here to be the desire of the British Government to bring about a new arrangement of the subject of "reparations" is regarded as being due as much to domestic trade considerations as to the necessities of the present situation. It is believed that the only way to ensure the eventual adjustment of the German obligations is to stabilize the situation, the first part of this plan being the stemming of the flood of marks which are having a ruinous effect on British trade.

CLIMAX IN IRISH NEGOTIATIONS FEARED.
LONDON, Nov. 30. Government circles to-day express the belief that the Irish conference held here last week almost immediately as a result of difficulties which had arisen and that a resumption of hostilities could not be far off. The alternative settlement plan presented by the Government to Sinn Féin representatives last evening included the necessity for a definite undertaking by Sinn Féin to take the oath of allegiance to the Crown. Sinn Féin has many objections to the Government's new plan, but even if it were to discuss this plan it will not be assent to the oath of allegiance. It is stated. There has been a hope of prolonging the truce and advancing the negotiations for an additional period of two months but this has now been abandoned.

A NEW PROPOSAL MOOTED.
LONDON, Nov. 30. The refusal of Ulster to enter an "All-Ireland" Parliament under present conditions, voiced in Belfast yesterday by Premier Craig, is not considered here as closing the door to settlement on the basis of the semi-official plan advanced yesterday. Under the plan the terms offered Ireland would be granted in treaty form and would be embodied in provisions of an "All-Ireland" Parliament, but would give Northeastern Ulster as defined by a boundary commission permission to declare itself out either at once or after a limited period. It is believed that Ulster, however, would balk at the intended reconstruction of her boundary, although no lessening of the total area now under the control of the Ulster Parliament is foreseen here. It was pointed out that the amputation from Ulster of the Catholic Districts might be balanced by the acquisition of Protestant Districts now assigned to Southern Ireland.
