Throughs Gone, But Horse Still Drinks.

A watering trough, monument to the days when horses were as common as Ford and water troughs as popular as oil stations, stands at Tenth and Washington avenues S., one of the last in Minneapolis. In 1917 and 1918 the city council ordered the removal of fountains at Fifth street and East Hennepin and at Sixth avenue and University avenue, southeast—Minneapolis Journal.

Marriages in Germany Show Decrease.

BERLIN.—The number of marriages and births in Germany for the first quarter of 1922 show a large decrease over the same period for 1921. According to statistics just issued, the number of marriages during these three months was 8.4 per thousand persons as against 10.4 for last year. The number of births was 23.6 as compared to 27.5, and the number of deaths was 18.5 as against 16.9 in 1921. The corresponding quarter for the year 1913 showed marriages were 6.2, births 28.8, and deaths 16.8.
