

According to statistics just issued, the number of marriages during these three months was 8.4 per thousand persons as against 10.4 for last year. The number of births was 25.6 as compared to 27.7, and the number of deaths was 18.5 as against 15.6 in 1921. The corresponding uarter for the year 1913 showed marriages were 6.2, births 28.8, and deaths 16.8.
