Salmon Fishing.—The fishing in Gaspe is the best this season that has been for the last thirty years. One gang of nets at the Peninsula caught 63 salmon on Monday last, another gang 47, the fish being of a much larger size than usual. The cod fishery on the coast is much better than last season. One firm, having 13 boats, landed in one day 108 drafts of fish, the fish also being larger than former years at this season. All our whaling vessels seven in number, have left for the Labrador and Newtoundland fishery with the exception of one, which will carry on the fishery between the north shore and Gaspe.
