COULSON HOUSE, GUELPH, June 25, 1869. The following are the arrivals at the Coulson House up to 10:30 this morning:

SALMON FISHING.—The fishing in Gaspe is the best this season that has been for the last thirty years. One gang of nets at the Peninsula caught 63 salmon on Monday last, another gang 47, the fish being of a much larger size than usual.

ERYSIPELAS OR ST. ANTHONY'S FIRE.—It is a spreading inflammation, characterized by a redness of the skin, accompanied by a sensation of heat and itching, and more or less a constitutional derangement with swelling of the subcutaneous cellular tissues.

BISHOP STRACHAN MEMORIAL CHURCH.—The corner stone of the Bishop Strachan Memorial Church at Cornwall, was laid with appropriate religious services on Thursday, by the Lord Bishop of Ontario.
