STARTED IN LONDON.

Phillpot Says His Disloyalty Originated Here

After the Local Barracks Was Burnt His Charges Against Booth and the Latter's Reply-The Lucan and Alvin-eton Cases.

It would seem that the fires of Phillpot evolt in the Salvation Army, according to brigadier Phillpot himself, were first indied in this city. The following is a sortion of Brigadier Phillpot's address in oronto the other evening, in which he laid are his charges against Commandant Sooth:

He knew of two cases at least, for they were in divisions over which he was in command. The places were Lucan and Alvinston. In these two places there is no Salvation Army now. Win was this? Why were they withdrawing their officers and selling their property in these places in Canada? This was the first thing that shocked him in looking at the conduct of the army.
