Parry Sound, Dec. 28 .- Coroner Dr. Stone and Crown Attorney Haight DONALD, vendors' solicitors, London, Ont. have returned from Snakeskin Lake, where an inquest was held on the body of William Dow, who was murdered by an Italian named Frank Capallo on Christmas night. The verdict of the

coroner's jury was equivalent to wilful murder. Frank Capallo, the murderer, and an accomplice named Marana fled northward toward Sudbury, and are being followed by two constables and a man with whom he worked last summer. Detective Greer has gone to Sudbury, to head the party off, and there are

hopes of capturing them. There is great excitement in the neighborhood where the crime was committed. The body of the murdered man was shipped to Cornwall from here this morning, deceased having come from that place and having friends there.

The three injured men, who are in the Parry Sound hospital, are doing as

well as can be expected.
