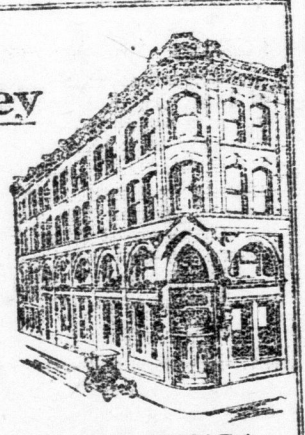

OVERHEAD, SINGLE TRACK, HIGH SPEED GERMAN
RAILWAY, ABOLISHES GRADE CROSSINGS.

The Monorail Line Capable of Unheard-of Railway Speed.

A monorail line that follows the perambulations of the Wupper River, Germany, is a railway which idealists believe is the pioneer of the ultimate, if rather Utopian dream of anti-grade crossing enthusiasts.

This elevated road carries suspended cars which run on a single track, being attached to large wheels, two to a car. The road is a trifle more than five miles in length, running from Elberfeld to Barmen. As may be seen from the illustration, the tracks are supported by girders which form an inverted V. The road operates by electricity, and the possible speed is limited only by the applied power.

Splendid Year
For Canada Say
Financial Men

"No Boom" Says Sir Thos
Shaughnessy, But "Safe,
Steady Business."

Montreal, Dec. 31.—Big financial magnates of Montreal, when interviewed concerning the outlook for 1914, were optimistic and predicted a revival of prosperous conditions. James Carruthers, president of the Richelle and Ontario Navigation Company, and a prominent grain exporter, was cheerful. "I think there will be a radical change in conditions early in the new year," he said. Sir Thomas Shaughnessy was of the opinion that the coming year would see a general improvement. "I am looking for a general upward trend in the financial world once we are passed the turn of the year," he said. "Money is already loosening up to an appreciable extent, and will continue to do so. After a pronounced depression such as we are passing through, a 'boom' cannot be expected. It would be better not; a steady movement is preferable."

WISH GRATIFIED

Sam Crockett is a great believer in the ancient adage "If at first you don't succeed, try, try, again." His faith in his truth was beautifully demonstrated Monday when he succeeded in getting himself sentenced to three months in jail on a charge of vagrancy. Saturday, Sam appeared before Squire Chittick on a similar charge, and earnestly requested to be given ninety days in jail. As he was strong and healthy, and a good workman at his trade, Squire Chittick did not accede to his request, but discharged him and advised him to look for work. Sam was not discouraged by this failure to become a boarder at Carter Castle, but immediately set out for Alisa Craig, where he had no difficulty in persuading the authorities that he was a vagrant. Magistrate F. B. Smith sentenced him to three months in jail, and he is now safely ensconced where winter winds do not penetrate and where the meals come at regular intervals.

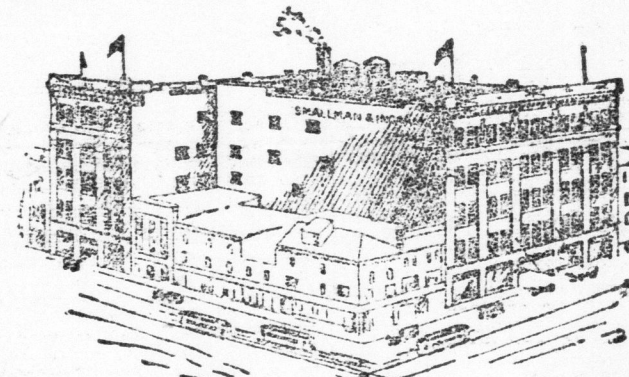
