## HON. MR. VENIOT'S IDEA.

St. John, Dec. 12.—A visit to this province by "Good Roads" Campbell, head of the federal department of roads, is expected, according to Hon. P. J. Veniot Minister of Public Works. Mr. Veniot stated this morning that it was probable Mr. Campbell would come here on an official visit.

The Minister of Public Works is enthusiastic in regard to the proposal of federal authorities to grant assistance to the provincial department of public works in the matter of roads; but did not favor the spending of all the proposed federal grant on a single trunk line in this province. The minister pointed out that the main connection between New Brunswick and Quebec was through Edmundston, and said this would be a very long route. The better connection and the shorter would be by way of the North Shore.

Mr. Veniot favored spending the money to best advantage on roads which would eventually be linked up to provide a trunk line to Upper Canada.

The following letter has been received by Mr. Arthur Fournier of

Eel River, after the death in France of his son Daniel.

France, Nov. 8th, 1918.

Dear Sir,—

It is my duty to write you concerning the death of your son Pte. D. Fournier, No. 793293 which occurred in the 26th General Hospital on Oct. 12th from wounds received while in action with the enemy on Oct. 1st. Shortly before going into battle your son received the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist, and I presume he was again prepared by the chaplain at the hospital.

In giving up his life for the sake of humanity, your son can truly say with our Divine Lord: "Greater love than this no man hath, that he lay down his life for his friends." And in paying the supreme price for such a noble cause he justly merits a martyr's crown in Heaven on an immeasurable debt of gratitude from mankind.

I extend to you the sincere sympathy of my heart in your sad bereavement, and pray our Divine Lord to grant Eternal Rest to the soul of your noble son. May perpetual light shine upon him.
