At the latter end of May, John Rolph Lee, Esq., M.D. This promising gentleman lately graduated at M'Gill College, and was on his return homewards, when in crossing the Grand River at York, the canoe upset, and he was drowned.

Suddenly at Windsor, N: S., the 4th ult., Francis Carten Pike, Esq., Surgeon, a native of Hampshire, England, aged 64 years. At St. Louis, Kamouraska, on the 23d ult., Thomas Horsman, Esq., M.D., aged 63 years. Mr. Horsman was born at Swinton, parish of Markham, Yorkshire, England. His father, a wealthy farmer, gave him a liberal education, and apprenticed him to the celebrated Dundas, then apothecary to George the Third. A short time after he emigrated to the United States, whither he followed an elder brother. Little satisfied with the national habits of our neighbours, to which he could not conform, after a sojourn of less than two years, he quitted the United States for Canada, a little before the war of 1812. He studied at Quebee with the late Dr. Francis Blanchet, who had him appointed Surgeon during the last war and placed over an hospital. In 1815 the hospital being closed, Dr. Horsman removed to Kamouraska, where his professional services, his sensibility, and above all his entarity towards the poor, guined him the esteem and confidence of all.—Quebee Mercury
