Indeed, the Eoonomic and Social Council, having a smaller representation, would perhaps be faced with the dilemma of having to reverse a decision taken a body larger and more representative then itself. Such a situation, in the opinion of my delegation, would be most ofbarrassing and might well jeopardize greatly the prestige One of the most important bodies of the United Nations.

The comments made by the Chinese representative produced a very profound impression on my delegation; he Sow attention to the effect. which increased representation on the Social Comnission might have on the International Children's Emergency Fund. As you know, the members of the Social Commission form part automatically of the Executive Board of UNICEF. Increased representation on the former would have the inevitable result of increasing the number of representatives on the latter. Here again, the financial implications deserve very serious corlsideration.
