Singapore's

international merchandise trade reached CAD\$160 billion in 1992, an increase of more than 2 times its trade levels of a decade earlier. Its overall trade deficit reached CAD\$4 billion in 1992.

Singapore is becoming successful in maintaining a diversity of trading partners and thus insulating itself from regional economic downturns.

Japan is the largest source of imports for Singapore, accounting for 21.2 percent o f Singapore's total imports. Japan, together with the U.S.A. and Malaysia, account for over 50 percent o f Singapore's total imports. These amounted t o CAD\$78 billion in 1992. Singapore's import sources have remained consistent over the decade.
