RESOLUTION ON BELGIUM

Belgium is a victim of the aggression of Germany against
the wider European community and against the peace and
stability of the world. The aggression of Germany against
Belgium is a violation of the Charter of the United Nations
and of the principles of international law.

The General Assembly has voted in favour of the resolution

sponsored by Belgium and other countries in paragraph 1 of the
resolution because we believe that the report of the Secretary-General
increasing number of countries would pose a threat to the
international community and that the only way to deal with the
situation is by a comprehensive system of disarmament and
a carefully verified system of disarmament. We are therefore happy
to see that emphasis is placed in this resolution on the necessity of
achieving permanent agreement. It is our belief that the
