problems that will be dealt with when we meet as a group of fourteen, and when we meet with regard to the French decision on Tuesday next, but I will be glad to entertain some questions for a few minutes.

MARCEL GINGRAS: Sir, do you already have the agenda of the meeting?

HON. PAUL MARTIN: Yes, we have the agenda.

MARCEL GINGRAS: May we know what are the main

topics, please.

HON. PAUL MARTIN: The agenda has not been given out as yet, but there is no real secret to this. First of all, the first item will be the state of the Alliance, and under this item we will be discussing the consequences of the French decision. Then we will have a general review of the international situation, which is the main item on the agenda of every foreign ministers' meeting. There will be also a discussion of the situation arising out of the Cyprus: problem and its involvement for two of our NATO members.

Those are the general headings that will form the basis of the meeting on Tuesday and Wednesday.

MARCEL GINGRAS: Is there any specific question like the NATO building in Paris, for example?

HON. PAUL MARTIN: On Monday the fourteen will meet. The Government of France has concurred in this separate meeting of the fourteen. I must underline the importance, as I have said, that the Government of
