

And the question being again proposed on the main motion: That Bill No. 7, An Act for the Control and Extirpation of Foot and Mouth Disease, be now read the third time;

Mr. Argue, seconded by Mr. Bryce, moved in amendment thereto: That Bill 7 be not now read a third time but that it be referred back to the Committee of the Whole House for the purpose of reconsidering an amendment thereto which would give the Minister of Agriculture authority to order and make provision for the supplying of feed and fodder to the owners of animals in any area quarantined by reason of the existence in Canada of foot and mouth disease.

Mr. Speaker ruled the proposed amendment out of order on the ground that it went beyond the provisions of the Resolution and of the Bill.

And the question being again proposed on the main motion;

Mr. Wright, seconded by Mr. Knowles, moved in amendment thereto: That Bill 7 be not now read a third time but that it be referred back to the Committee of the Whole House for the purpose of reconsidering an amendment thereto which would provide for the payment of compensation to any persons suffering losses of income by reason of the existence in Canada of foot and mouth disease.

Mr. Speaker ruled the proposed amendment out of order on the ground that it went beyond the provisions of the Resolution and of the Bill.

And the question being again put on the main motion: That Bill No. 7, An Act for the Control and Extirpation of Foot and Mouth Disease, be now read the third time; it was agreed to.

The said Bill was accordingly read the third time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Fournier (Hull), the House then adjourned at 5.50 o'clock, p.m., until tomorrow at three o'clock, p.m.
