PRAYERS.

A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate had passed the following Bill to which the concurrence of this House is desired:

Bill S-3, An Act to provide for the dissolution of the Dominion Coal Board and for the repeal of the Canadian Coal Equality Act, the Coal Production Assistance Act and the Dominion Coal Board Act.—Mr. Greene.

Mr. Basford, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House, —Copies of the joint statement issued following a meeting between the Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs and the United States Attorney-General held at Washington, November 3, 1969, relating to anti-combines and antitrust matters. (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 6/131.

By unanimous consent, it was ordered,—That the said joint statement be printed as an appendix to this day's Hansard.

Mr. Sharp, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,— Copies of the communique dated October 31, 1969 issued following the meeting of the Consultation Committee of the Colombo Plan held at Victoria, B.C. (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 6/28.

Mr. Fortin, seconded by Mr. Laprise, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-141, An Act to amend the Interpretation Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.
