Mr. Herridge while the names of those in favour of sustaining the Speaker's ruling were being recorded:]

**Mr. Herridge:** No, Mr. Speaker.

**Mr. Nowlan:** Would the Speaker please put the question so we know where we are?

**An hon. Member:** Call for those opposed.

**Mr. Speaker:** I had called for those in favour, and if there are no other hon. members in favour I am about to call for those opposed.

*And the result of the vote having been announced: Yeas, 106; nays, 106:*

**Mr. Speaker:** Since the decision has not been negative, I declare my ruling sustained.

[Later:]

**Mr. Cashin:** Mr. Speaker, I should like an opportunity to declare that I was paired. Had I voted I would have voted to sustain Your Honour's ruling.

**Mr. Frank Howard (Skeena):** Mr. Speaker, I should like to raise a question of privilege regarding the mines, forests and waters committee. I do so because this is the first time it has come to my attention that the committee is meeting to study the matters which were referred to it.

At page 559 of *Votes and Proceedings* for November 15 last a motion appears, moved by the hon. member for Winnipeg North Centre (Mr. Knowles), which was carried, stating in effect that my name be substituted for that of the hon. member for Kootenay West (Mr. Herridge) on that particular committee. So far to date I have received no notification that the committee is meeting. If a motion were to be moved on this matter I think it would be to the effect that the chairman of that committee be instructed to carry out his functions and notify all members of that committee of the times and places of meetings of the committee.

**Mr. Gene Rheame (Northwest Territories):** Mr. Speaker, on a question of privilege, certain matters were referred by this house, prior to the holding of committee sessions, to the standing committee on mines, forests and waters. When the matters referred to it by this house were brought forward for discussion, the chairman of that committee ruled that those matters could not be considered because they were out of order; that they must be referred back to this house for approval before they could be raised. When the hon. member for Lapointe attempted to carry out the instructions of that committee you, Mr. Speaker, ruled him out of order.
