

4. Rental of Victoria S-D building. (Assumption: city of Victoria will not grant severance). Total rentable area 25,000 sq. ft. at \$15 per sq. ft., yearly rental of \$375,000 escalated at 10 per cent per year (inflation factor) discounted at 15 per cent for 10 years (time horizon of proposal), \$2,895,750.

(b) Salaries contributing to the manpower reduction of 30 employees at \$25,000 a year (average salary), an annual savings of \$750,000 per year escalated at 10 per cent per year, discounted at 15 per cent for 10 years, (time horizon of proposal), \$5,791,500.

(c) Rental savings, Vancouver, B.C., \$347,540 per year, escalated at 10 per cent per year (inflation factor) discounted at 15 per cent for 10 years (time horizon of proposal), \$2,683,703.

(d) The purchase of WCB Clinic provides 100,000 sq. ft. of required space that, if not purchased, would have to be replaced by (1) new construction at \$100 per sq. ft. or \$10,000,000 or (2) rental at \$15 per sq. ft. yearly rental of \$1,500,000 escalated at 10 per cent per year (inflation factor), discounted at 15 per cent for 10 years (time horizon or proposal), \$11,583,000.

Net cost over 10 years; \$6,771,797.

(b) It is not possible to separate these budgetary allocations by province because, with the exception of alternative payments to the province of Quebec, the amounts are paid to lending institutions or collection agencies and not to provincial governments. As well, in some cases, loans are not authorized by the provincial authority in which the lending institution or agency making the loan is located.

Motion No. 51 (revised)—**Mr. McKinnon:**

That an order of the House do issue for copies of all letters, papers and studies concerning the move of RCMP Headquarters "E" Division from Victoria to Vancouver, British Columbia.

Motion agreed to.

**Mr. Hal Herbert (Vaudreuil):** Madam Speaker, I have a half dozen motions on the Order Paper at the present time which date back to last December. I should like to draw the attention of the parliamentary secretary to Motion No. 56 in particular. It calls for the production of a copy of the latest signed agreement between the government and the province of Ontario under the Canada Assistance Plan. Because it is my understanding that the government is prepared to table this document but that the government of the province of Ontario is refusing its consent, I think the matter should be clarified. I therefore ask the parliamentary secretary if, after the call for motions for the production of papers next Wednesday, he could clarify this point. It is relevant, obviously, to the discussion this fall on the renewal of the fiscal transfer payments with the provinces. The importance of this item is self-evident.
