put upon foort, and some time after balf allowance, When they arrived at the Cape, they there met with the admiral in the Namur, subich was great joy to them; and our heroine being disappointed bitberto of meeting ber faitbless busband, and now seeing the seet in company, was in bopes of acquiring Jome glory as a fildier, knowing the reason of this fleet's being fitted out was to annoy the enemies of her country, which foon bappened according to ber wifees, as the fleet foon failed from the Cape for Morusus, on which place they began their first attack; which did not hold long, I shall now proceed to their march so Pondicherry: The march continued eleven weeks part of which time they had no bread, most of their food being rice; and the many bombs and fells thrown among them, killed and wounded many of their men, during this space of time, the behaved with the greatest bravery and interpidity, such as was confiftent with the character of an English foldier, and though deep in water, fired Thirty feren rounds of shot, and received a foot in the groin, fix fout in one leg, and five in the other. The seize being now broke up, she was sent to an bospital at Cuddylorom under the care of two able physicians, but the not willing to be discovered, extracted the ball out of ber grein berfelf, and always dreft that wound; and in abone three months was perfectly cured; but most of the first being failed before ber recovery, the was left behind, and ent onbeard the Tartar Pink, aubich then lay in the harbour, where the remained, doing the duty of a failor, vill the return t the fleet from Mudrass, when she was turned over to the Sam, Capt. Lloyd, and failed for Bombay, where they arrived in about ten days, then they failed to Montferrat, to take the Royal Duke Indiaman under coavoy, to being her to Fort St. David's. At Bombay ber master being on shore, she was obliged to watch in her turn, as is ufual on fuch occasions. The Elebam failed with the rest of the sleet from Fort St. David's and kept company tili they came to the Cape of Good Hape; when the Eltham had orders to make the best of ber way to Lifton, they fet fail from Liften the 3d of May, and arrived at Spithead the Ift of June, from thence she proceed ed to London, without ever being discovered, and arrived fafe at her brothers, Mr. James Gray, Curpenter, in Ship Street. Wapping, to the great joy of all her friends.
