omitted two poems by Doctor Odell: The American Times, and The Word of Congress—which are already edited in The Loyalist Poetry. To the critical reader, who may object to the occasional omission of a phrase allowable enough in the last century, but too coarse for the more delicate palate of this, he would urge that in every such case a dash has been substituted for the discarded word; so, in the language of Peter Pindar,

-Let thy impudence supply the rhyme!
