

## CHAPTER V.

## FINIS CORONAT OPUS.

HE shore-end of the new cable was

carried by a powerful two-thousandton ship, the William Corry, which arrived off Valentia Harbour on the morning of Saturday, July 7th, and immediately began to lay it. This shore-end was of huge size, weighing twenty tons to the mile, and was to be brought off on a bridge of boats reaching from the ship to the foot of the cliff. For this purpose all the fishing-boots along the coast were hired, and H.M.S. Racoon sent up her boats to help; so that, when arrayed in line, there were forty of them, forming a very fine and extensive pontoon. worked well, and by one o'clock the cable was landed, and the William Corry slowly stood out to sea, keeping westward, until she had laid the entire length of thirty miles which she had on board.
