Good Demand for Choice Stock at Higher Prices-Hogs Ouoted at Advance.

MONTREAL, Feb. 19.—At the Montreal

Stock Yards, West End Market, the receipts of live stock for the week ending Feb. 17 were 1425 cattle, 25 sheep and lambs, 3000 hogs and 450 calves. The supply on the market this morning for sale consisted of 25 cattle, 100 sheep and lambs, 1575 hogs and 150 calves. The undertone to the market for good to choice cattle continues strong and prices for such have scored a further adprices for such have scored a further advance of 25c per cwt. since this day last week, owing to the small supplies coming forward and the keen competition between buyers. Sales of full car loads of choice northwest ranch cattle weighing 1500 pounds each, were made at \$6.00 per cwt., and choice Ontario steers, weighing from 1200 to 1300 pounds each, brought \$6.75 and in broken lots as high as \$7 to \$7.25 was paid. There were a few choice bulls on the market, which weighed from 1800 to 2000 pounds each, and they sold at \$5.50 to \$6 per cwt. 1800 to 2000 pounds each, and they some \$5.50 to \$6 per cwt.
There was no change in the condition of the market for the lower grades of cattle, owing to the fact that the supply cattle, owing to the demand was was ample, for which the demand was only fair. There was a good attendance of buyers, including some frem Quebec and as they all wanted some beef, a fairly active trade was done, a good many cows and bulls being bought for shipment to Quebec.


