Absconder Clarence Murphy's Case Befere the Supreme Court. Salem, Mass., Jan. 4.-The Indeterminate Sentence Act, so called, was declared to be unconstitutional by the full bench of the Supreme Court in Boston to day. The case in question was the sentence of Clarence Murphy of this city, convicted of embezzlement from the Salem Savings Bank, in which institution he was a clerk. He absconded from the bank on Dec. 2, 1893, After un exciting chase he escaped to Canada, was at liberty until Feb. 1, 1899, when he was arrested in San Francisco. He was tried convicted and sentenced to State Prison for a term of not more than 15 or less than 10 years. The decision today does not invalidate the conviction of Murphy. He will be taken into court again for sentence.
