hands, and are consequently greatly encouraged, to devote themselves afresh, and with redoubled energy, to the work of the Ministry.

In the Cobourg District we are happy to notice that the downward tendency which has been evinced for some years, in a decrease of members, is arrested; and that after making up for a number of removals, several deaths, and backslidings, there is a small increase, and in the Quarterly and Missionary receipts a large advance on the past year. From the reports of some of the pastors we discover an increasing desire to concentrate labor in the centres of population; in our towns and villages. This we consider a step in the right direction. Peterboro report says: "The town requires regular Ministerial labor, both in the pulpit and also in pastoral visitation, in order to secure and maintain the position we desire in this growing and prosperous commercial centre. The report from Dummer says:

Seymour seems to present a brighter aspect than for several past years. The pastor says: "This year we have aimed more at consolidation, than extension. We have made some little progress. Sinners have been converted to God; the congregations in most places have increased; about seventy have signed the temperance pledge. We have a small increase in our membership.

In Huntingdon the societies are reported as living in peace ; congregations good, and the week night services, with few exceptions, well attended. A Sabbath School was opened last year and another this, with the most cheering prospects. The Quarterly and Missionary receipts are far in advance of last year. At Zion a new shed, stable, and carriage house have been built and paid for.

The members are nineteen more than last year. Financially we have exceeded our most sanguine expectations; our missionary receipts alone being over \$70 in advance of those of last
