DECEMBER is the name applied to this month in the Alban and first Roman calendar, in both of which it was the tenth, as the name signifies, or last of the year. At first, this month consisted of thirty-five days; but Romulus reduced it to thirty, and Numa to twentynine. Julius Cæsar restored the day of which Numa had deprived it; and Augustus added another day, which it still retains. December was called thus by the Romans, as the tenth month in their calendar, from decem, ten, and imber, a shower, it being part of the wet season. This was the fourth month of the civil and the tenth of the sacred year of the Jews, who called it Zebeth, signifying 'miry,' probably on account of the difficulty of passing on the roads.
