Cusack was by vote of 21 out of the 31 members of the council summarily dismissed from office and Charles W. Weyman appointed to suc-ceed him. On Thursday morning the sec-retary-treasurer, G. O. D. Otty, tendered Mr. Cusack the one month's salary pro-vided for in the act, in lieu of one month's notice. Mr. Cusack refused to accept the money and served the secretary-treasurer with a notice in which he claims that his drsmissal was illegal, that he should con-tinue to prosecute his duties of Scott act inspector and lay information against of-fenders. Pursuant to this decision he at-tended the court of Stipendiary Magis-trate Hornbrook at Sussex today and pro-ceeded with the cases in hand as though his newly elected successor, Mr. Weyman, was not present. The cases have gone over for a week, but the end of the municipal cuncil's troubles is not yet in sight. 


